1. About Us

In2MedSchool is a widening participation initiative that supports underprivileged school children in the UK applying to study Medicine and related subjects at University.

We are a registered charity with the Charity Commission for England and Wales (1197973) run by a group of medical student and junior doctor volunteers. We have a free 1:1 mentoring scheme to support students aged 16 - 18 years old who come from widening participation backgrounds. We also create events and resources to support all people applying to study Medicine at University and carry out school visits through our IAP and SEP teams.

2. What Can You Do To Help?

Some ways you can fundraise:

- Organise a bake sale at your school/university/work
- Organise a sponsored walk/run/cycle
- Organise an event such as bingo, a disco, a talent show or a quiz
- Organise a raffle

3. Where Does The Money You Raise Go?

The money you raise will allow us to continue to offer free support to those applying to study Medicine at University. We do this through our:

- 1-1 mentoring scheme
- Academic guidance
- School visits
- Personalised interview support
- Work experience programmes
- Events







3. Where Does The Money You Raise Go?

£35 allows two of our volunteers to visit local schools and give presentations and work shops on the medical school application process.

£50 amount allows our volunteers to visit Fresher's Fairs to recruit more volunteers and spread the word about our work.

£600 allows us to hold a mock MMI event where 90 students get first hand experience of what a medical school interview is like, to prepare them for their interviews. This includes supporting some attendees in travelling to the event.
